On the 6th May Charles III became our oldest new monarch when he was crowned King, with Queen Camilla by his side.

If a coronation mirrors a monarch's reign and our changing times, what did King Charles's multi-faith, multilingual service featuring a "hummable" anthem, a "homage of the people" and a blended but broken family, say about the new Carolean age?

With two hours of ceremonial splendour dating back a thousand years, updated for a 21st-century king with a swaying gospel choir and Ant and Dec, Charles ensured a page was visibly turned in the history books. This was a lifetime away from 1953.

Even the spotless blue and yellow carpet of the coronation theatre in which King Charles and Queen Camilla were crowned brought a contemporary feel to proceedings - but in a happy diplomatic coincidence, they were also the colours of the Ukrainian Flag.



From the Rectory

The great Anglican spiritual director who lived for many years in Wolseley Road, Fr Reginald Somerset Ward, once wrote 'I always wish that in the Gospels we had more detailed accounts of Our Lord's holidays. It is certain as a matter of principle that He took holidays. I am sure that they must have been full of joy and unselfishness; but the details would have been a great help'. This is probably as close as Fr Somerset Ward ever got to a joke, but I'm sure he meant it as well. Due to the Coronation, three out of five Mondays this month will have been holidays and I hope you will have been able to enjoy them suitably.

Thursday 18th May was Ascension Day, a great occasion in the Church calendar but one which tends to get left out nowadays. One of the congregation at the evening service at St John's remembered how all the local schoolchildren where she grew up had a day off for Ascension Day which of course made it rather easier to get to the local church at some point – not that I'm sure even a similar gesture would have the same effect now!

One of the charges the Puritans in the 16th and 17th centuries made against the medieval Church was that it encouraged people to spend

too much time not working. With all the feast days and celebrations scattered through the year, so many days were lost when productive work could have been done and money made. Thankfully over time the Church remembered that human beings need more time to themselves than just spending most of one day a week in church, and so events such as Ascension Day once again became a holiday, at least for schoolchildren. Eventually the State began to legislate for people to have breaks from work, and our secular Bank Holidays and statutory time off reflect the fact that, as in so much, ordinary society has taken over from the Church important things that help to make life better for people. That's not a bad thing: it shows that the Church has succeeded.


Fr Somerset Ward insisted that there were three priorities in life: prayer first, rest and recreation second, and work third. Of course holidays only make any sense if you have work to contrast them with, but the Church of Jesus Christ has always believed that human life needs that balance and has worked to make sure that people get it – even if we're unlikely ever to know anything about Jesus's vacations. Enjoy yours, whenever they come.

We're grateful to Ruth Jansen of Elstead who recently passed us two old copies of the parish magazine from 1955 and 1956. The older one has this sketch of the inside of the church on the cover, which we don't remember seeing before. The old chancel screen (moved in the 1970s) and the pulpit (dismantled in the 1980s) can be seen, but we think the artist has exercised some artistic licence as far as the pews are concerned, as there doesn't seem to be a way to get into them!



On Saturday April 1st Revd Zachary Allen, retired vicar of Rustington in Sussex, stopped on a cycle ride to visit St John's. His father was curate here in the early 1950s and when Zachary was born in 1952 his parents gave a clock to the vestry in thanksgiving for his safe arrival (Zachary's father had an interest in clocks). The clock doesn't work any more, but we are delighted to know its history. There is a very faded label on it recording it as 'given by Zachary Allen', so clearly he was a precocious child.

In 2017 Katy Parker decided that she needed to do something new. Her first love had been working with horses, and she knew she wanted to carry on looking after animals in some way. It was husband Richard who suggested dog grooming, and this led to a course at Merrist Wood College, and starting Vanity Fur. At first Katy dealt with a handful of dogs each day at home, but the work soon

outgrew the Parkers' spare room, especially as dog ownership soared during the Covid lockdowns when people turned to pets to bolster their mental health, and business never slowed down again – far from it. Clients reached ten a day and a cabin in the garden wasn't the right solution; then 50 Binscombe Crescent fell vacant and the company moved there a few months ago.

Now Vanity Fur employs not just Katy but her mum, Richard, and two other members of staff, and has 1600 dogs on its books! Katy is modest about the salon's success so far: 'I didn't really do anything,' she says, 'I just started grooming dogs and it all took off. People will do a lot for their dogs, because they mean so much to them'. She loves her own pet Pomeranians most of all, but the salon looks after all different breeds and sorts of dog, and there's now a small shop selling canine items and treats alongside the salon. Vanity Fur is about to launch an online shop too. Another Farncombe business adding to the variety of our parish!

The Farncombe Initiative

This year The Farncombe Initiative has continued to work on ongoing projects and is studying new ideas.

As readers of The Villager will know, in early May local elections were held for the councils of Waverley Borough and Godalming Town.

The Farncombe Initiative is politically neutral. However, we thought that it would be helpful for the electorate if the candidates of all parties standing for election in our local area let us know their position on some of the important issues for all of us.

These issues were:

1. Widening the footpath alongside the railway between Farncombe Street and Marshall Road to improve access.

2. Improving local public transport.

3. Stopping any expansion of the car park at Godalming Leisure Centre which would involve the acquisition of part of the playing fields of Broadwater School.

4. Encouraging local businesses in Farncombe and the creation of a monthly street market by Farncombe station to attract people to the village centre.

All candidates responded positively and many of them are now Waverley Borough and/or Godalming Town Councillors so are in a



position to follow through with their commitments. It should be noted that one candidate, since elected, felt that the establishment of a street market

should not be to the detriment of existing businesses, which is entirely reasonable.

The Farncombe Initiative will continue to engage with our elected representatives on these and other issues of local importance.

On Saturday May 20 we were present at St John's Spring Fair and met many local residents interested in our activity and how they could get involved. Thanks to Paul Devereux we had a large display of material relating to local history, especially that of the Broadwater estate and the Marshall family. One person brought and donated a number of photos and a newspaper report on the demolition of Broadwater House where members of his family had worked.

Kettle's On Coronation Tea

We celebrated the Coronation with a Film Show. From the Surrey Archives John found three films. The first, old footage of the 1953 Coronation of Queen Elizabeth showing the procession along Godalming High Street. The second, Godalming celebrating the 400 years of Godalming being a Borough, again with a Procession, and thirdly, the 1977 Queen's Silver Jubilee Procession as it leaves from Summers Road. The 1953 film quality was Black and White and not always clear but delighted everyone as we spotted old shop fronts and tried to identify the groups and organisations on the backs of lorries. The film maker then moved on into the Burys to record a Tableau held on a stage. It shows Queen Elizabeth the First and Courtiers all in very elaborate costumes but sadly there is no sound and we could only guess the theme of the play. The film opens with a delicate solo ballet dancer. Of course, everyone was performing in the rain.

The Borough Celebrations were in a similar style with lots of Brownies and Scouts seen in "Proper Uniforms" as someone pointed



out. In both films there were a lot of smartly turned out horses, either being ridden or pulling floats or carriages.


The Jubilee Film was the most successful having clear images in colour! Recent weather has not been conducive to spending hours out in the garden but at least we haven't had to do too much watering! A number of plants have shown the effects of last summer's heat and it may take some experimentation to find suitable replacements but it is good to see large splashes of colour in the flower beds and fruit and vegetables showing early signs of good crops.



Vegetables Potatoes are now in leaf and should be earthed up regularly to provide protection for the crop and it is time to plant out crops like sweetcorn, marrows, courgettes and squashes as well as runner and French beans. Sprouts, leeks and celery can also be planted out now but remember to prepare the ground first and add fertiliser.

Fruit If possible, mulch strawberry plants with straw to keep the fruits dry as they grow and also to deter unwanted 'visitors'. Tie in new raspberry canes as they grow and check bush fruits like gooseberries and thin out fruits if they are overcrowded.

Ornamentals Garden centres have large displays of annuals, which give colour over the summer and it is good to check shrubs when they have finished flowering and prune as necessary to keep them in shape. Although we have had plenty of rain so far it is wise to check that water for the garden is available and can be stored if possible. Weeding is always something to keep us busy but it is possible to use some species as the basis for a wild flower garden which helps our pollinating insects too.



D of E PRACTICE EXPEDITION



Penny is also currently the Surrey County Councillor for Godalming North. Councillor John Ward was Mayor from May 2022 and supported the Jigsaw Trust and Creative Response. He successfully raised just over £2180 for the charities during his time as Mayor.
