# From the Rectory



Some years the camellia in my garden is bursting with blooms by the end of February, and there are many around the parish far nicer than mine. This year, as March begins, only one flower has come out, and a few buds look as though they might bloom at some point but seem very reluctant to venture into the light. What a mercy it was that Spring was much nicer when we were all confined to barracks three years ago! In the wake of that crisis everything seems so much more of a struggle with little to encourage us.

The Christian faith talks a lot about Hope, which is one of the 'spiritual virtues', but what we hope for is the final redemption of the world, including us, at the end of all things. It doesn't mean that everything will go all right, either for us as individuals, or for the world in general; we have no guarantee of that at all, and the truth is, of course, that we absolutely know that dreadful things happen in this fallen world and individuals and countries get caught up in them. So how does the virtue of hope cope with that knowledge? A friend recently sent me a Lent reflection which suggests we think about 'hope' in a different way, and I was so taken by it I thought I would share the ideas – so this is not my thought, but something I have found useful.

The Greek word the ancient Christian spiritual writers often used for hope was agon, and you don't have to be very clever to think of English words that relate to it. It means something like 'struggle' or 'ordeal', and the old writers used metaphors like warfare or childbirth to think of what this kind of 'hope' is like. Hope in this sense is about doing your best to act rightly in whatever task is in front of you: it means not falling victim to despair or imagining that we can save the world by our own efforts. Hope is a determination to act rightly because that's our vocation as human beings living under faith, leaving the bigger picture to God in the knowledge that he is faithful and in charge. This makes hope hard work, but also makes it something which doesn't depend on what we feel, but what we choose to do, and that, it seems to me, is a good thought.

I found this reshaping of the idea of 'hope' fitted with other things I have been thinking for a long time, and it was very helpful to have it stated in that way. We can't control the future, but we are called to act, to deal with what's in front of us, to put one foot in front of the other. That's what makes us human – in Lent as at any other time!

# ONE SMALL STEP FOR WOMANKIND

#### **News from Binscombe Surgery**



It's International Women's Day on March 8th. I can't help thinking that the ultimate validation of this celebration of the achievements of women

would be to make itself irrelevant; that we would have come so far in the struggle for sexual equality that an event like International Women's Day would no longer be needed. Sadly, it is all too evident that we remain a very long way away from such a dream. However, one small step towards removing an injustice against women will happen in the UK from April. It is tiny in the grand scheme of things, and not a big enough step even for what it is, but it is still something to be welcomed, and it relates to prescription charges for Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT).

The menopause, by definition (and despite men's protests that surely there must also be a male menopause!) only affects women. Many women sail through it without much difficulty, but for some, symptoms such as hot flushes, night sweats, sleep disturbance, joint pains, effect on mood and more can have a huge impact on quality of life; HRT can be hugely beneficial in these circumstances. Unlike contraception, however, there is no exemption on a prescription charge for HRT and, since most

women on HRT are below the age of 60, many will have to pay for their prescriptions. What is more, because it often involves a prescription for both an oestrogen and a progesterone, this is two charges every time. If the doctor issues 2 months' worth at a time (as we are meant to) this would be 12 prescription charges, or £112.50, per year.

Rather like the VAT on tampons, this has seemed like a tax on being a woman, and there has long been a campaign for HRT to be exempt from prescription charges. Well, at last there has been a change to the law, which will come into effect from April. Don't get too carried away, it is not a complete victory as there will still be a charge, but it is a step on the way, and maybe it will make it easier for a future government to abolish the charge altogether.

The way it will work is that a woman will be able to pay an annual prepayment charge of £18.70 which will then cover all prescriptions for the full range of HRT products over the next 12 months, which would mean a typical woman on combined HRT would save a little over £90 per year. The prepayment would only cover HRT, so if someone is on other medication it may work out cheaper to make a full prepayment charge of £108.10 which covers all prescriptions, but for a woman whose only medication is HRT this is definitely a step forward. If this might help you then please wait until April to discuss it with your pharmacist, as they have not yet been sent all the paperwork for it, but you should be able to make use of this next month.





Many forms of identity used now include a photo as proof of who we are. This is intended to prevent others impersonating us and it can be an important safety measure. Photo ID will now be needed when voting in elections so it is becoming necessary for everyone to have some form of photo ID or they will lose the right

to vote. Whilst this is intended to prevent fraud it is also a way of deterring those who wish to vote but do not have, or know how to obtain, the necessary identification and could lead to a distortion of the results of elections. This could be an advantage to candidates whose supporters are more used to carrying their ID and would pervert the results of elections by favouring unrepresentative candidates. Make sure you get your photo ID before the next elections so that you can vote - it will be very important.

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend our stall and my apologies for the incorrect date I gave in the Winter Villager.

Since the Winter Villager was published, we were told that TraidCraft had gone into administration and it is likely that they will cease trading in due course. This causes a problem for St John's and many other churches that offer Fairtrade stalls as TraidCraft were our supplier and an important link in the Fair Trade chain. They worked with a range of suppliers to source products and, through their Fair Trader scheme, made it much easier for volunteers to stock and run a Fair Trade stall without needing to deal with multiple suppliers and minimum order

We will continue to run the Fair Trade stall while stocks last. We hope that alternative suppliers will emerge to fill the gap left by

TraidCraft, however it is likely that there will be a hiatus while we consider what to do next.

The good news is that the Fair Trade community continues to support producers around the world who make the products we enjoy every day. Look-out for the Fair Trade logo in our local supermarkets (Co-Op, Sainsburys, Waitrose), the Peppered Pear Pantry in Godalming and Fair Trade shops around the area, including Guildford Cathedral and Emmanuel Church in Stoughton. Please do let me know if you find other suppliers locally.

St John's is proud to be a Fair Trade church and continues to support Fair Trade through our refreshments - our tea, coffee and sugar comes from Kingdom Coffee, a Fair Trade supplier to churches and businesses around the country.

# The Farncombe Initiative

This year The Farncombe Initiative has continued to work on ongoing projects and is studying new ideas.

#### **SIGNAL BOX**

As is well known, Farncombe signal box is scheduled to close this year. Although we were unable to preserve this building, we are in contact with Network Rail with a view to having its nameplate and panel on permanent display in the booking office. We also recorded an interview with the signalman which will form part of the oral history of our village which we are compiling.

#### ROAD MARKINGS

Our direct contact with Surrey County Council Highways have resulted in progress being made on painting these. However, we have identified further places where remedial work is needed. A further list of these has been sent to SCC.

# BLOCKED DRAINS AND OVERGROWN HEDGES

These are widespread problems and action needs to be taken especially before the Spring growing season. TFI is writing to SCC about this, but we encourage all to report problems they meet by using the website www.fixmystreet.com. This is surprisingly effective.



#### POT HOLES

The situation with these is similar. Progress has been made, but after so many years of neglect much remains to be done.



#### FOOTPATH BETWEEN FARNCOMBE STREET AND MARSHALL ROAD

This runs parallel to the railway line with a wire fence and hedge on the railway side and new building on the other. This is very narrow, too narrow for two buggies to pass, and poorly lit at night. TFI is committed to intervening with SCC and Network Rail (owner of the railway land) to obtain a widening of the footpath to remove this unsafe bottleneck.

FARNCOMBE INITIATIVE

#### FARNCOMBE STREET MARKET

TFI has proposed that a monthly market be held on a Saturday morning on the car park in North Street, opposite Farncombe station. This is owned and operated by Waverley BC, but our proposal has the support of Godalming Town Council which has initiated a feasibility study. A trial market was proposed for September but now progress awaits the resolution of a regulatory issue, notably the impact on existing local businesses. We're hopeful that this will go ahead and encourage more people to use Farncombe's shopping and catering businesses on a regular basis. TFI is co-operating closely with Godalming TC on this project.

#### TREES!

Good news! Under GTC's "Farncombe Village and Binscombe Community Vision" one of the planned actions is to encourage the planting of trees in our area. Funds are available for this and now it's time for our community to get involved. Firstly, please propose public spaces which you think benefit from tree planting. Later there may be opportunities to get involved not just in the planting, but also the care and maintenance of the trees.







# SPRING GARDENING

Spring is a very busy time in the garden, with old vegetable crops to take out, ground to prepare and new seeds and plants to put in. Planning ahead is important, as is trying not to get over-ambitious remember that plants grow and get bigger but the space stays the same!

**Vegetables** Sow crops such as cabbage, leeks, cauliflowers, peas, beans, spinach, lettuce and carrots through the season to extend the cropping period (and hopefully dodge any late frosts). Potatoes and onions should be planted according to their type, potatoes can be earlies, main crop or late and onions vary according to variety. Keep up with the weeding on a regular basis otherwise it could damage the crops, make sure the soil is well fertilised and put in supports for climbing beans before planting them.

**Fruit** Established fruit trees and bushes will need plenty of feed as they start to grow and produce flowers so put compost round the base of trees and some liquid fertiliser, which is also good for new bushes and plants grown in containers.

**Ornamentals** Springtime is the busy time for sowing hardy annuals outdoors as well as planting new perennials, dividing overcrowded perennials, pruning bush and climbing roses, preparing hanging baskets, sowing tender annuals in a frost-free place, dead-heading bulbs and generally clearing up, weeding and enjoying the fresh air.

There is a lot to do in the garden but it provides good exercise and fresh air and a feeling of achievement as you can see what you have been able to do. Happy gardening John.





# IT'S TIME TO TACKLE THE MOSS

How to scarify your lawn for the best results



- This is best done each autumn or spring
- Use a proprietary moss and weed killer first (dead and dried moss is much easier to remove than lush green growing moss)
- Leave for a period of time for this to work (often 1 to 2 weeks)
- Wait for a warm day when the grass is dry (wet grass does not scarify too well), but not so dry that the grass is parched as it will already be under stress
- Set the tines so they just touch the surface of the soil, removing the thatch but not damaging the roots
- Scarify the lawn, some areas may only need one pass but others may need more attention
- If there is a lot of thatch produced (and there usually is) the best way we have found to collect it is by mowing the grass again using the mower to compact the thatch in the grass box
- To help growth apply a top dressing (lawn sand, fertiliser and fine loam) which can be spread using the back of a garden rake

The use of fertilisers or moss killers is not our area of expertise and information on these is best obtained from a horticulturalist at your local garden centre.
